THE SCHOOL OF CRIMINOLOGY

The School of Criminology is inviting applications for **three** tenure-track positions at the Assistant Professor level, starting September 1, 2008. The School has a well-established undergraduate programme with over 700 majors and minors. It also offers graduate programmes leading to the degrees of M.A. and Ph.D. There are exceptional research opportunities which include access to the Criminology Research Centre, the Institute for Studies in Criminal Justice Policy, the Institute for Canadian Urban Research Studies, the International Centre for Criminal Law Reform and Criminal Justice Policy, the Mental Health, Law and Policy Institute, the Centre for Restorative Justice, and the Centre for Forensic Research. The teaching faculty is multi-disciplinary and, at present, consists of 29 members. Courses are taught at both Simon Fraser University: Burnaby, and Simon Fraser University: Surrey.

POSITION ONE:

DUTIES: To undertake research, and to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the School of Criminology in criminal justice with an emphasis upon police studies. Applicants must be prepared to teach other courses to be determined upon appointment.

QUALIFICATIONS: A Ph.D. completed by September 1st, 2008 is required. Applicants must specialize in criminal justice with an emphasis upon police studies.

POSITION TWO:

DUTIES: To undertake research, and to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the School of Criminology in any one of the following areas: family violence (i.e., spousal abuse, child abuse, and/or abuse of seniors); or, victimology; or, international human rights. Applicants must be prepared to teach other courses to be determined upon appointment.

QUALIFICATIONS: A Ph.D. completed by September 1st, 2008 is required for applicants interested in either the family violence or the victimology areas. A Ph.D., or an LL.M., completed by September 1st 2008 is required for applicants interested in the area of international human rights. Applicants must specialize in one of the specified areas.

POSITION THREE:

DUTIES: To undertake research, and to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the School of Criminology in the area of criminal justice policy. Applicants must be prepared to teach other courses to be determined upon appointment.

QUALIFICATIONS: A Ph.D. completed by September 1st, 2008 is required. Applicants must specialize in the area of criminal justice policy.

NOTE:

Simon Fraser University is committed to the principle of equity in employment and offers equal opportunities to qualified women and men, including visible minorities, Aboriginal people and persons with disabilities.

These are entry-level positions (Assistant Professor). **Only those holding or those eligible to be promoted to the rank will be considered.**

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
